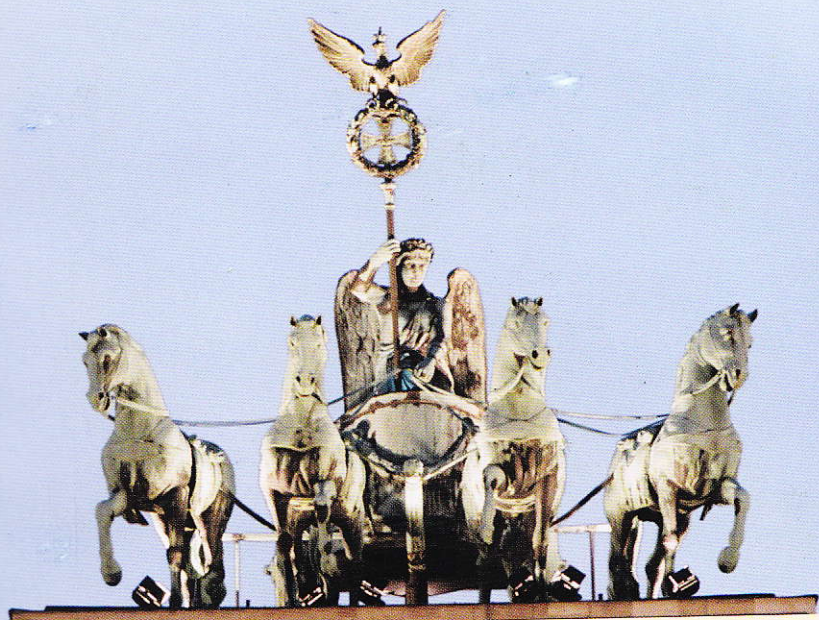

Psychiatry in Europe is facing several challenges. While the numbers of patients with mental disorders is rising and the demands for mental healthcare services are increasing, economic limitations become increasingly important and have led to increased discussions about prioritization of services. Another challenge is the implementation of evidence-based guidelines in clinical practice. This will be promoted by ongoing European efforts to define the most suitable indicators of the quality of mental healthcare, and by a common European guideline platform based at the European Psychiatric Association. Finally, the numbers of psychiatrists need to be sustained and efforts are warranted to attract more young medical doctors into the specialty of psychiatry and psychotherapy. To this end, one of the important elements will be to develop common European standards for training programs in psychiatry and psychotherapy as a medical specialty. This is currently underway by initiative of the Union of European Medical Specialties. Taken together, psychiatry in Europe is currently facing a wide range of challenges but is also striving to develop a uniquely European professional stance.
